

Local Heritage Assets

- A Local Heritage List is a method for the community to identify valued heritage assets that are distinctive elements of the local heritage and important to the identity of Seend Parish.
- Just like heritage assets designated nationally (listed buildings and structures), and Conservation Areas designated locally, Local Heritage Lists have an important role in celebrating heritage that is valued by the community at the local level.
- The Steering Group have started work on identifying locally important heritage assets in the parish. The list below gives suggestions as to the kind of assets we are looking to identify:
 - Rare, unusual assets that are distinctive to Seend Parish;
 - Assets which represent a particular architectural period, movement, company or group in the parish;
 - Assets which are of architectural interest;
 - Landmark buildings or structures that contribute to a view;
 - Valued open spaces;
 - Street furniture of particular importance;
 - Groups of assets with a clear, visual, design or historic relationship.
 - Assets with artistic interest that show creative skill (could be sculpture, memorials, gates, railings, decorations, advertisements);
 - Assets associated with an historical person or event of importance to Seend Parish;
 - Assets of archaeological interest.
